



AFFORDABLE HOUSING CRISIS

Homeownership offers families stable housing costs because mortgage payments on fixed-rate loans don't increase, unlike rents. Since much economic inequality is rooted in the racial gap in homeownership rates, it is critical to launch a renewed effort to boost the U.S. homeownership rates among people who have been shut out of this important means of building

HOW HABTAT FAMILIES BUILD

The path to homeownership with Habitat for Humanity is a process, but it's well worth the investment. When families partner with us to build and purchase their homes, they commit to a process that takes time, but ultimately builds a strong foundations for the future.



Meet eligibility requirements and apply for the program.



Build or renovate their future home.



Complete the application process and



Purchase the home with a 0% interest mortgage.



Complete 300 of hours of education and sweat equity.



Maintain and pay off the home over time

talents, gave Mariza an up close and personal view of Habitat's mission in motion. Mariza and her four children moved into their Habitat home in January 2022.


